U.S. 81 THROUGHOUT



Nearby to Fort McFerson, over which fate presided the bar of our country, pure, proud and unshaken by defeat. As we take of our lot in stable, unshakable our appreciation and thankfulness that we live in the grand and glorious country where the Meridian Road is not a possibility, but an accomplished fact.

The Gulf Division.

The trip from Waco to Galveston, over the Meridian Road, is known as the Gulf Division. It helps to view a different view entirely from that experienced on Meridian Road above the first-named city. You simply have to travel over the Gulf Division to realize that difference, and we leave it to the tourist to see.

MARTIN MIGHTY IN MEN AND MINERALS.

There are several interesting communities in the rough Meridia, with 5,000 population, the county seat of Falls County, and located on the H. & T. C., and the I. & G. N. Here is where you head for when the inner man or the outer man is inclined to complain. It is not a paradise for all the time that man is here in—there's not the climate for the summer waters of Martin; but the cars are so wonderful, so varied, and so sure, that we are woe to claim almost all of that for this resort with the magic waters. Then the people are a progressive bunch. They are the folks who, when the Meridian Road was being first exploited by the Long Logging Party, sent Mr. Doby word that they had an auto, or a train of autos at his service, with which to buy the Gulf Division. It is that spirit that leaves Martin on the map as the most progressive of the progressives. Indeed it is the city to see and to visit.

BOAST OF BRYAN IS A. & M. COLLEGE.

Bryan is one of the noted places of Texas, for here is located the A. & M. College, where 1,000 boys are learning their life's business, the big school being maintained by the State, and by the U. S., and is situated four Bryan six miles, connected by interurban. Bryan is the county seat of Brazos County, and has a population of 7,000, and is on the H. & T. C., and the Fort Worth branch of the I. & G. N. Situated in the richest of the rich farming country of Texas.

NAVASOTA NEED NOT BLUSH.


After we pass Wethurn, the next stop is Navasota, which is happy in the possession of 4,000 population, and has three railroads: M. & T. C., I. & G. N., and the G. C. & S. P. Here is where we see saw mills, lumb and heading factories, and other signs of industrial enterprise.

HENNSTADT HAS HEAVY HARVEST.

Hennstead is located at the junction or fork of the H. & T. C., and is the county seat of Waller County, and claims a population of 2,000. The sea level of elevation is recorded at 2,870 feet. This is the great harvest dream, and of waterworks—it is published that 1,000 cars are shipped every season—all other truck in proportion.

THEY CALL IT HEAVENLY HOUSTON.


Then there is Waller, Swanton, Hattoma, Hennes, and then on into the Bayou City, the capital city of Harris County, with its twining hummocks, indeed, to be precise, Houston claims 115,000 population. Historic Houston not only sounds good, but is the truth; being the first civic effort of the Republic of Texas, by General Sam Houston and the Allen family after the battle of San Jacinto, when Texas broke the Mexican in 1836. Owing to a disagreement the Harris family located Harrisburg and the Allens located Houston, and today it is said that Harrisburg is about the same size and size a suburb of Houston. Tired of the advantages of Houston and one would almost think the sun rose and set in Houston. Largest inland cotton shipping port, largest banking center in the Southwest, largest oil development, largest lumber business, largest industrial and manufacturing enterprise, and so on and so forth. Its hotel facilities are unsurpassed, and it claims the record in sky scrapers.





Federal Highway Maps



Composite Map Showing Alignments Over Time





For the information of house-
wives who wish accurate informa-
tion on relative costs in planning
nutritional and at the same time
delicious meals, the food adminis-
tration has issued a table showing
comparative cost and food value
of fifty foods.

Each is taken as the standard
for comparison, and the most per-
cent and the relative cost per
hundred calories of the other ma-
terials is shown. The prices given
are averages of those in 25 places
throughout the country on August
1. The table shows that 12 arti-
cles are cheaper than bread on the
basis of calories obtained for the
money, two are of equal value, and
eight are higher. Corn meal, notwith-
standing its present high prices,
proves to give the most food
value for the money. Broiler
chickens stand at the foot of the

list. Experts of the food adminis-
tration think that an intelligent
use of this table will help house-
wives. They point out that it
would be impossible for a family
to keep in health if it were fed
entirely on the foods in the low-
part of the table. Their ad-
vice is that the housewife continue
to prepare the usual meal of ven-
ison, and utilize this table as
a guide in making combinations
which will save money and at the
same time be nutritious. For in-
stance, canned tomatoes, compared
with bread, are a very expensive
item. This should not lead to
the substitution of tomatoes, but

on August 1.

Historic Texas Highways

Today, the Lone Star State is crisscrossed with a jumbled tangle of high-speed highways and byways. It was not always this way. In the late-1800s and into early 1900s, the traveler had only dirt, gravel, and occasionally paved roadways from which to choose. As automobiles became more popular, the demand for better and safer roads increased, leading to the Good Roads movement. This in turn led to the improvement and expansion of the roadway network across Texas and across the nation. The development of communities was closely linked to transportation, whether waterways, roadways, or railways. As auto travel increased in the 1920s and '30s, towns connected by roads prospered due to the ability to sell and trade goods, and by providing places for travelers to stop for food, lodging, and vehicle care.

A rich architectural legacy from this early time period still remains along these early roadways, including gas stations, motels and hotels, diners and cafes, auto dealerships and repair shops, parks, signage, bridges, and tourist attractions. Meridian Highway



The Meridian Highway historically has been the major north-south named highway in Texas since the early 1910s. As originally conceived by the International Meridian Association in 1911, it stretched from Canada to Mexico, extending through the nation's mid-section and the expansive Great Plains region. Its path cross approximately 800 miles of Texas, passing through Burkburnett, Wichita Falls, Fort Worth, Cleburne, Waco, Taylor, Georgetown, Austin, New Braunfels, San Antonio, Cotulla, Laredo, Bryan, Hempstead, Houston, and Galveston, among other communities, and roughly followed IH-35W with a major lateral from Waco to Galveston following SH6/US 290.

The Texas Historical Commission is undertaking a two-year study to document the history of the Meridian Highway. The project will result in a written history of the Texas section of the Meridian Highway and a survey of the Texas Meridian route, including associated historic resources: auto repair garages, gas stations, diners, tourist camps, auto courts, motels, road markers, paving, and traffic signs. This effort is funded by the Texas Legislature and the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT)
