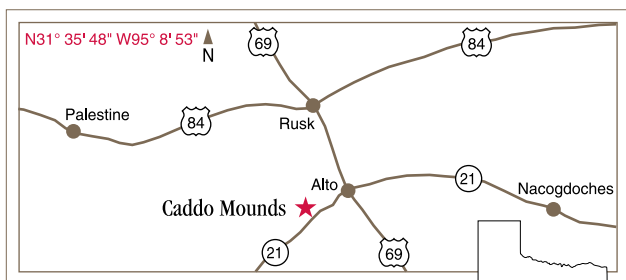
CADDO MOUNDS

More than 1,200 years ago, a group of Caddo Indians known as the Hasinai built a village and ceremonial center on the prairie overlooking the Neches River. The site was the southwestern-most ceremonial center for the great Mound Builders, a culture which spanned the eastern North American woodlands for more than 2,500 years. Today, three earthen mounds still rise from the lush Pineywoods landscape. Discover the everyday life of the Caddo people through captivating exhibits and displays; view the mounds used for burials, religious ceremonies and a temple; and explore the history of this ancient site.
