FANNIN BATTLEGROUND

On March 20, 1836, Col. James W. Fannin surrendered to Mexican forces at the Battle of Coleto Creek. Mexican Gen. Santa Anna then ordered Fannin and 342 of his men executed in nearby Goliad, against the wishes of other Mexican commanders. The surrender and execution inflamed the Texas cause, spurring the battle cry "Remember Goliad!" This site memorializes the soldiers who fought on this field. Walk the grounds and view the stone obelisk that honors the spot where Fannin surrendered. Remember the men who helped forge Texas' destiny.
