Eligibility for **HISTORIC TEXAS LANDS** recognition

Landowners must have <u>completed at least one</u> of the following actions:

- 1. <u>Transferred ownership</u> (via donation or sale) of an archeological site to the THC, other state agency, or non-profit land trust, for the purpose of permanent preservation of the site;
- 2. <u>Sold or donated a permanent conservation easement</u> (i.e. not a term easement) to the THC, other state agency, or a non-profit land trust. This easement must provide for <u>permanent</u> conservation of one or more significant archeological sites;
- 3. **Designated one or more State Archeological Landmarks** by **completing** the following three steps:
 - *Nomination of the site*
 - *Designation of the site by the THC*
 - Filing with the appropriate county clerk's office

- 4. Allowed substantial and significant archeological research on their property.
 - "Substantial and significant archeological research" means survey, testing, or major excavation.
 - The research must contribute significantly to our knowledge of Texas archeology, or directly lead to permanent preservation of one or more significant sites.
 - The results of that research <u>must be published</u>

OR

• ALL materials, including all artifacts, notes, records, etc., from the research must be <u>curated</u> at an approved state repository.
